RULES GOVERNING THE COMPETITION
GENERAL

1. The Competition shall be held for two days on 7th and 8th of February, 2020 (Friday & Saturday).
2. All participants must be currently pursuing their Bachelor's degree in Law, i.e., either 3 year or 5 year courses recognized by Bar Council of India. **The language of the Competition shall be English.**
3. The team must be composed of bona fide students of the Institution, they are representing. The Organizing Committee reserves the right to verify the identity of the participants at any time during or after the competition.
4. The Organizing Institution shall reserve the right of registration.
5. Each participating team shall consist of three members i.e. two speakers and One Researcher. Due to an exigency the Organizing Institution may allow a two member team to participate in the Competition.
6. One team only is permitted to participate from a School/College/Department/Centre.
7. The participating teams shall bear the travelling and all other incidental expenses.
8. The Organizing Institution shall provide free boarding and lodging to the participating teams. Accommodation to the Participating teams shall be provided from Fore noon of 06.02.2020 to Fore noon of 09.02.2020. Accommodation and any other services will not be provided for any member apart from the three participants under any circumstances.
9. The Dress Code for the Competition: Female: White Salwar Kurta with Black Blazer or white shirt and black trousers along with black coat and tie. Male: White shirt, black trousers, black tie along with black coat and black shoes.
10. During the Competition, the participating teams shall maintain decency and decorum of the Court and conduct themselves in the manner befitting of the legal profession.

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11. The Organizing Institution shall have an inherent power to make Rules on any situation not covered in the Rules.
12. The decision of the Organizing Committee shall be final with regard to the interpretation of the Rules and on any other matter or matters relating to the Competition.

MEMORIALS

13. Each team shall submit Memorials for both Appellant and Respondent.
14. The text of the Memorial shall not exceed 25 pages. The Memorials shall be typed on A4 size paper with standard margins on both sides in Times New Roman with font size 12 with double line spacing.
15. Each team shall submit 06 copies of Memorials for each side. The name of the institution or the names of the student participants shall not appear at any place in the Memorial.
16. The Team Code allotted shall be typed at the top right corner of the cover page of the Memorial.
17. The cover page of the Memorial for the Appellant shall be in blue colour and for the Respondent in red colour. Prefer chart paper for cover page. Also prefer cotton thread stitches. Table of Contents i. List of Abbreviations ii. Index of Authorities iii. Statement of Jurisdiction iv. Statement of Facts v. Issues Raised vi. Summary of Arguments vii. Arguments Advanced viii. Prayer

CONDUCT OF THE COMPETITION

1. The competition shall be conducted in four rounds – Preliminary, Quarter, Semi and Final Rounds.
2. In the Preliminary rounds each team shall argue for both sides. The marks of the each preliminary round shall be the cumulative total of the marks of both the speakers and the marks of the Memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
3. Top eight teams that score the highest marks in the Preliminary rounds shall become eligible to enter into the Quarter finals. Draw of lots will decide the competing teams in Quarter Final round.
4. The criteria of marking in Quarter Final round are aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers.
5. Quarter, Semi and Final rounds shall be held on a Knock-Out basis.
6. In case of tie between teams, in quarter finals, the aggregate total of the marks of memorials (appellant or respondent) of the teams shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.
7. Top 4 teams shall compete in semi-finals. The criteria of marking in Semifinal round are aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers.
8. In case of tie between teams, in semi-finals, the aggregate total of the marks of memorials (appellant or respondent) of the teams shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.
9. The winner of each round shall move to the Final. There shall be only one FINAL ROUND. The marking criteria in Final Round are same as that of semi-finals i.e. by calculating the aggregate total of the marks of both the speakers.
10. In the preliminary rounds each team shall get 30 minutes time. The two Mooters can adjust the time between them. But, no Mooter shall argue for more than 20 minutes.
In Quarter and Semi Final rounds also each team shall get 30 minutes time. In all these rounds each team shall get 2 minutes time for rebuttals.
In the Final round each team shall get 40 minutes time and 5 minutes for rebuttals.
11. Oral arguments shall generally confine to the Memorials. Memorials are valued separately. Both Memorials put together are valued for 50 marks.

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Oral arguments for each side (i.e., for Appellant and Respondent) shall carry 100 marks.

Argument of each Mooter shall be valued for 50marks.

12. During the course of oral submissions the participants cannot submit to the court any material containing pictorial representation whatsoever. Further the participants will not be permitted to make any audio/visual representation nor will they be allowed to use personal computers, laptops and any other technical or mechanical device during their oral submissions.

13. No member of any team will be permitted to witness the arguments in any courtroom in which that team is not one of the participating teams whilst that team is a part of the competition. If this rule is violated, the Organizing Committee shall take strict actions, which may include but may not be limited to, the expulsion of the said team from the competition.

PRIZES AND AWARDS:

The team that scores the highest in the Final Round shall be declared as the “Winners” and shall be awarded a trophy and a certificate of merit.

The other team that qualifies to the Final Round shall be declared as the “Runners up” and shall be awarded a trophy and a certificate of merit.

“Best Speaker” shall be determined on the basis of the highest average marks obtained in the preliminary round, and shall be awarded a trophy and a certificate of merit.

“Best Memorial” shall be determined on the basis of the highest marks obtained in the

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memorial round, and shall be awarded a trophy and a certificate of merit.

Every participating team shall be awarded 'Certificate of Participation.'

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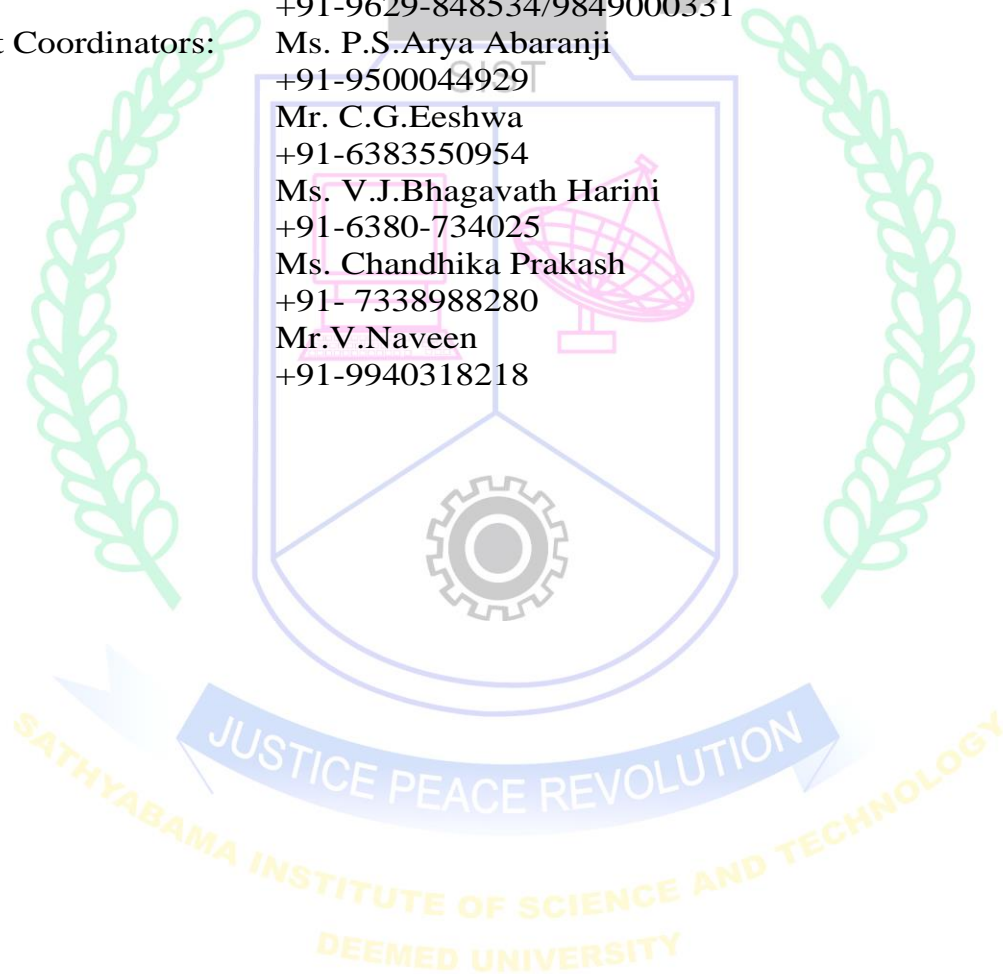
