

GENERAL AUTHORS' GUIDELINES

SCOPE OF THE JOURNAL

Exclusive submissions to the JSLPG must be based on issues revolving around sports law, policy and other allied areas. The content of articles must be suitable for readership among students, practitioners, researchers and academicians alike.

RELEVANCE OF THE JOURNAL

The JSLPG aims to highlight original and novel contributions to the existing gamut of legal scholarship on Sports Law, the Policies surrounding it, and the Governance Structures that form the roots of this arena. Furthermore, the submissions must possess an analytical stance over the issue being discussed in the manuscript and provide a spick and span outlook of the content. JSLPG understands that some manuscripts are descriptive in nature and build upon the existing framework of knowledge and ideas, but we expect a logical and coherent argument to be forwarded, debated and conclusively commented upon by the author. Suggestive content based normative manuscripts is also welcomed. In toto, the content should reflect the contemporary areas of sports law and its allied fields of study.

LANGUAGE POLICY

Only submissions in English are allowed. The language of the submissions should also be formal and precise, adhering to the submissions guidelines of the journal. Submissions using offensive language and defamatory references will be rejected.

COPYRIGHT VIOLATION

To ensure that, the submissions are not in violation of copyrights laws, the authors are required to obtain written permission from the owner for the use of any copyrighted material in the manuscript, and the same must be communicated to the journal.

All present and future lawsuits arising out of any intellectual property violation committed by any author/co-authors would be the sole responsibility of the violating party, and JSLPG would bore no liability for the same before any courts.

Before finalising the manuscript for publication, the author/co-authors are required to submit the copyright declaration form, failing which the manuscript would not be published. All disputes are subject to local laws and jurisdiction.
