








ABOUT RAFFLES UNIVERSITY, NEEMRANA


Mrigyaniki v. Union of India and Ors.

- 1. *Mrigyaniki* and *Devashya* were happily wedded in the year 2005 and were the parents of *Kshmika* (14 years old daughter) and *Amasya* (8-year-old Son). For the past 20 years, *Devashya* was working as the Chief Priest of Vrindvasini Temple of Meharganj state of the Republic of Indonia. On 23rd April 2021, *Devashya* got infected with a deadly virus and was quarantined for months. Meanwhile, *Mrigyaniki* took over the position of the Chief Priest of Vrindvasini Temple.
- 2. On 19th October 2021, *Devashya* died due to the virus, making *Mrigyaniki* a young widow. After *Devashya's* death, *Mrigyaniki*, went through all the customary rituals prevailing in the village which a widow is bound to do to demonstrate grief and loyalty towards her husband like, shaving off her head, giving up her colourful clothes, jewellery, and her favourite food. The customs also demanded her to walk bare foot all her life, being absent on all auspicious occasions, including marriages and festivals. She was also removed from her position of the Chief Priest of Vrindvasini temple as, according to their customary practice, a widow cannot be a Chief Priest.
- 3. On 1st November 2021, the Vrindvasini Temple Trust invited an application for the position of Chief Priest for the Vrindvasini Temple with the following criteria in the notification no. 111/2021-
- i. The Applicant shall be the resident of Meharganj state.
- ii. Shall be a Brahman by birth.
- iii. Shall be well versed with the language of the State.
- iv. Shall be either male or female.
- v. Shall be single, married or a widower but not a widow.





- 4. *Mrigyaniki* being a widow, was not eligible to apply for the position of Chief Priest for the Vrindvasini Temple. As *Mrigyaniki* was the only bread earner of the family, she started searching for an employment in the vicinity of the village, but as she had no educational degrees, she started working as a cook and used to cook at various occassions and festivals. One fine day, on the eve of a local harvest festival, *Mrigyaniki* was denied by the trustees of Vrindvasini Temple to cook the auspicious first meal of the season (bhog) which is served to the Lord Bhupati, as she was a widow. *Mrigyaniki* could not believe what happened to her and felt very insulted.
- 5. *Mrigyaniki* with other widows of the village decided to go to the Mateshwari temple located nearly 1000km away from Meharganj where usually the widows go to find solace. *Mrigyaniki* with other widows went to the Dandeshwari Temple thinking it to be Mateshwari temple where they were denied entry by the watchman claiming that the temple allowed only married and unmarried women and widows were strictly prohibited to go inside the temple. The widows protested but were eventually not allowed as it was an age-old custom.
- 6. *Mrigyaniki* narrated the entire incident to her children and ultimately with the help of her daughter sent the following postcard to the Apex Court: -







On 19th October 2021, Flost my husband, then my sources of income, then the right to enter the temple and eventually the will to live only because Fam a widow. I don't wish to live anymore as the world doesn't treat me as a human anymore that too without any fault. I wish, Sati existed.

I am glad for only two reasons, one is that I still have the right to write this postcard to my lord and secondly, that postcards don't have a marital status. As I am unable to pray to the almighty god at the temples, I pray to my lords, the protectors, for the first and last time that if you're reading this and can do anything for me, please protect the fundamental rights of all the widows of this land, including me, from being violated.

Mrigyaniki

- 7. The honourable Supreme Court treating the postcard as a writ petition said that the technicalities cannot stop the court from protecting civil liberties of the individuals and took cognizance of the case by framing the following issues-
- I. Whether the termination of a widow from being the Chief Priest of the temple is valid or not?
- II. Whether the exclusion of widows through the notification no. 111/2021 by the Vrindvasini Temple Trust is in violation of fundamental rights under the Constitution of Indonia?
- **III.** Does widow's exclusion from cooking the *bhog* amount to violation of fundamental rights under the Constitution of Indonia?
- **IV.** Whether the act of denying entry to the widows in the temple by the Dandeshwari temple authorities violate the fundamental rights under the Constitution of Indonia?

NOTE-

- 1. The laws of "Republic of Indonia" are pari materia with the laws of INDIA and the decisions of INDIA are of significant value to the Republic of Indonia. The Apex Court of the Republic of Indonia also relies on the precedents of International Courts and Tribunals.
- 2. The participants are required to prepare their submissions from each side of the case.





VENUE SCHOOL OF LAW, RAFFLES UNIVERSITY

RULES AND REGULATIONS

I. AIM & PURPOSE

C.L. Agrawal Memorial National Moot Court Competition has been conceived with the aim of creating opportunities for learning the development of jurisprudence on emerging trends in law besides developing cutting edge skills in research, writing and advocacy.

II. VENUE AND DATE

8th C.L. AGRAWAL MEMORIAL NATIONAL MOOT COURT COMPETITION, 2024, shall be held at *School of Law*, *Raffles University*, *Neemrana*, *Rajasthan* from 8th to 10th March, 2024.

III. THE COMPETITION SHALL BE HELD IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE.

IV. ELIGIBILITY & TEAM COMPOSITION

- (i) Each team shall comprise of three (3) members out of which two (2) will be speakers and one (1) researcher. An observer is allowed to be brought to the competition with a condition that he/ she shall not intervene in any proceedings.
- (ii) The competition is open for *bonafide* students pursuing 5 Years and 3 Years Law programs in India.
- (iii) <u>Each Law College shall be eligible to send one team.</u> Each team shall be provided with the TEAM CODE. Team should not disclose the identity of their institution in course of proceedings in the court rooms; such disclosure shall invite penalties including disqualification.

V. REGISTRATION

- (i) The teams are requested to send an e-copy of the Registration Form to mcc@rafflesuniversity.edu.in on or before 21-02-2024.
- (ii) A registration fee (Non- Refundable) of Rs. 4500 /- (Rupees Four Thousand and Five Hundred Only) is to be paid by way of Online Money Transfer / UPI / Paytm / Google in favour of Raffles University. The charges for observer will be Rs. 800 (Eight Hundred only) per day.

- (iv) No change in the names of the participants shall be permitted after the receipt of the Registration Form, except at the sole discretion of the Organizers.
- (v) Teams should clearly mention the participants name including year/ semester of study.
- (vi) The moot court will be conducted on Date: 8th March to 10th March 2024.

The inauguration function will commence sharp at 04:00 PM on 08/03/2024 followed by draw of lots.

VI. DRESS CODE

Inside the court room, the participants must strictly follow the below-mentioned dress code.

- (i) Females: White Salwar kurta & Dupatta or white shirt and black Trousers along with black coat and tie.
- (ii) Males: White shirt, black trousers, black tie along with black coat and black shoes.

VII. COMPETITION ROUNDS

There shall be Two Preliminary Rounds, Octa-Finals, Quarter-Finals, Semifinals, and a Final Round spreading over a period of 3 Days.

Preliminary Rounds

- (i) In preliminary rounds each team shall argue from **both the sides** (**Plaintiff and Defendant**).
- (ii) The team shall be credited with a WIN in a preliminary round if their round total is more than opposing team.





- (iii) The marks of the EACH preliminary round shall be the cumulative of the marks of both the speakers and the marks of the memorial of the side in which they are appearing.
- (iv) The total marks of the preliminary rounds shall be the sum total of the marks of both the prelim rounds.
- (v) No team shall face each other more than once in the Preliminary Rounds.
- (vi) **TOP SIXTEEN** (16) teams shall move to the Octa-Finals on the basis of the marks of the preliminary rounds.
- (vii) The following criteria shall be observed in deciding teams which are to move forward to Octa-Finals: -
- a) The teams that have TWO wins in preliminary rounds shall proceed to the Octa-Finals.
- b) In case less than 16 teams score two wins then teams that have 1:1 WIN LOSS ratio shall advance based on their aggregate score in the Preliminary Rounds.
- c) Teams that have TWO wins shall be given preference over those which have 1 WIN and 1 LOSS.
- (viii) In case of a tie between two or more teams, the aggregate of the score of oral submissions of the speakers shall be taken into consideration.

Octa-finals

- (i) Happening of Octa-Finals is subject to change in case participating teams' number is less than 30.
- (ii) It shall be a knock- out round and the winner of each round shall move forward to the quarter finals.
- (iii) The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate of the marks of both the speakers in that round.
- (iv) In case of tie between teams, in Octa-Finals, the aggregate marks of memorial of the side in which the teams are appearing shall be counted. The Team with highest marks moves ahead.

Quarter-Finals

- (i) Eight (8) teams shall compete in quarter final. Criteria for qualifying to quarter finals have been mentioned in previous clauses.
- (ii) It shall be **a knock-out** round. The winner of each round shall move to the semi-final. Four (4) teams shall move to semi-finals.
- (iii) The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate of the marks of both the speakers in that round.
- (iv) In case of tie between teams, in Quarter Finals, the aggregate of the marks of





memorials of the side in which the teams are appearing shall be counted. The team with highest marks moves ahead.

Semi-Finals / Final

- (i) Four (4) teams shall compete in semifinals. The criteria of qualifying in semifinals have been mentioned in pervious clauses.
- (ii) It shall be a knock-out round. The winner of each round shall move to the final.
- (iii) The criteria of marking in this round are aggregate of the marks of both the speakers in that round.
- (iv) In case of tie between team, in semifinals, the aggregate of the marks of memorials of the side in which the teams are appearing shall be counted. Team with highest marks moves ahead.
- (v) There shall be one (1) FINAL Round.
- (vi) The marking criteria in Final Round is same as that of semifinal.

Note: The teams shall be allotted their respective sides through draw of lots.

VIII. MEMORIAL

- (i) All teams must submit Memorials/ Written Submissions for both sides (Plaintiff-Defendant).
 - a. Memorials must contain the following:
 - b. Cover page / Cause title
 - c. Index
 - d. Index of Authorities
 - e. Table of Cases
 - f. List of Abbreviations
 - g. Statement of Jurisdiction
 - h. Synopsis of Facts
 - i. Issues Raised
 - j. Summary of Arguments
 - k. Arguments / Pleadings
 - 1. Conclusion / Prayer.
- (ii) The arguments shall not exceed Twenty (20) pages and the Memorial shall not exceed Forty (40) pages.
- (iii) The Memorial shall be typed on A4 size page in Font type: Times New Roman, Font size: 12, 1.5 line spacing & 1-inch margin on each side. For citation Blue Book 20th edition must be followed.





- (iv) The Cover Page of the Memorial must follow the following color scheme, **Blue** for the Plaintiff Cover Page and Red for the Defendant Cover Page.
- (v) The Memorial must be "Spiral Binding" ONLY. No services regarding spiral binding will be provided by the university.
- (vi) If any team needs to get photocopies done in the university, it would be charged.
- (vii) The Memorial must not contain any Annexure/ Photographs/ Sketches/ Exhibits/ Affidavits etc.
- (viii) Memorials that do not comply with the above- mentioned specifications will be fined.
- (ix) Soft copy for each side (Plaintiff and Defendant) must reach the organizers latest by **01-03-2024** (**Friday**) to Moot Court Committee at mac@rafflesuniversity.edu.in, and hard copy of the same and compendium shall reach the School of Law, Raffles University, Japanese Zone, NH- 48, Neemrana- 301705 District- Alwar, Rajasthan, India latest by **04-03-2024** (**Monday**). Total of 5 hard copies must be submitted to the organizers out of which 2 of each side are to be delivered by **04-03-2024** (**Monday**).
- (x) Identification of any type shall attract severe penalty.

IX. MARKING CRITERIA FOR MEMORIALS

- (i) Memorial from each side shall carry total of hundred (100) marks.
- (ii) The following shall be the criteria for marking the memorials.

(iii) A penalty of two (2) marks for each side of memorial shall be entailed on each day default in submissions of memorials

X. ORAL SUBMISSIONS

- (i) Each team shall comprise of two (2) speakers, as has been specified earlier.
- (ii) Each team will have a maximum of **Thirty** (30) minutes to present their Oral **Submissions in Preliminary Rounds**. No speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than Seventeen (17) minutes. This includes the time the speaker addresses the Court during the rebuttal. The maximum time for rebuttal is Five (5) minutes.
- (iii) Passing of chits will only be allowed during Preliminary rounds. The maximum time allotted in Octa and Quarter Finals is Forty (40) minutes for oral submission and no speaker will be permitted to address the Court for more than Twenty-Two (22) minutes inclusive of Five (5) minutes for rebuttal.
- (iv) The semifinal rounds will be of Forty- five (45) minutes and the final round will be of fifty (50) minutes for each team. No speaker shall be allowed to address the court for more than Twenty-Five (25) minutes and Twenty- Eight (28) respectively.
- (v) At the commencement of each session of Oral Submissions each team shall notify the Court Officer as to the division of time between the 2 speakers.
- (vi) If any speaker continues to speak after the completion of his / her time, he/she shall entail penalty which shall be upon the discretion of the judges.
- (vii) Speakers shall not be allowed to pass annexure to the judges; instead, the teams may make a Compendium of annexure that shall be given to the judges before the start of proceedings.
- (viii) During the course of the Oral Submissions, no speaker shall reveal his / her identity nor the identity of their University / College by any means whatsoever.

XI. MARKING CRITERIA FOR THE ARGUMENTS

- (i) Each Speaker will be marked on a total of 100 marks by each Bench Judge.
