Format: The manuscripts can be in the form of Articles (4000-8000 words), Case Notes (2000-5000 words), Legislative Comment (1000-3000 words), or Book Reviews (1000-3000 words). The prescribed word limits are exclusive of abstract and footnotes.

The Citation style to be followed by the authors is the Oxford University Standard for Citation of Legal Authorities (4th ed., 2012).
