RULES OF THE COMPETITION

GENERAL INFORMATION:

- These are the rules for the 3rd Fairfield National Moot Court Competition -2024.
- The 3rd FIMT- National Moot Court Competition, 2024 (hereinafter referred to as “competition”) shall be conducted on March 14th and 15th, 2024 in virtual mode, and the final round shall be conducted on March 30th, 2024 in physical mode at FIMT Campus, Kapashera, New Delhi 110037.
- The Organizing Committee (OC) shall function as the point of contact, and any changes to the rules of the competition shall be notified by email to all participating teams.
- The competition shall be conducted in accordance with the rules mentioned hereunder.
- Participants are required to comply with the rules and procedures prescribed herein.
- The official email for all correspondence with respect to the competition is fimtsolmootcourt@gmail.com

1) DEFINITIONS

- a) “**Appellant**” means the team that argues on behalf of the appellant at any given point in the competition.
- b) “**Bench**” refers to the Judges in the oral rounds collectively.
- c) “**Bluebook**” means the Bluebook Method of Citation (20th edition).
- d) “**Clarifications**” refer to the clarifications and corrections to the moot problem issued pursuant to Rule 6 of the rules of the competition. They shall form part of the moot problem.
- e) “**Competition**” means the **3rd Fairfield - National Moot Court Competition in 2024**.
- f) “**Compendium**” means a compilation or collection of legal or other authorities upon which a team seeks to rely during the oral round.
- g) “**Identity**” means any fact pertaining to the identity of the team, its members, or the Institution/College/University represented by the team, and the State or region where such Institution/College/University is located. This includes any identification marks or seals of the team or the Institution/ College/University represented.

- h) **“Judge(s)”** refers to the adjudicator(s) of the oral rounds.
- i) **“Memorial”** means the memorandum of written submissions submitted by any team, as per Rule 7 of the competition's rules.
- j) **“Memorial Exchange Session”** means exchanging of the memorials of opponents' with each other before the oral rounds commence.
- k) **“Memorial Scores”** means the score determined in accordance with Rule 10 of the competition's rules.
- l) **“Oral Rounds”** means the oral pleadings presented before a bench, as explained in Rule 9 of the Rules of the competition.
- m) **“Oral Score”** means the score given by a Judge in accordance with Rule 10 of the rules of the competition.
- n) **“Organizing Committee” or “OC”** means the committee, including any other authorized persons, appointed for the administration and conduct of the competition and all events leading up to the competition.
- o) **“Rebuttals”** refer to the set of arguments/challenges that the appellant shall raise at the end of the main pleadings of all the orators.
- p) **“Researcher”** means the member of a team who is not a speaker.
- q) **“Researchers’ Test”** means a written test conducted during the competition in accordance with Rule 8 of the competition's rules.
- r) **“Respondent”** means the team that argues on behalf of the respondent at any given point in the competition.
- s) **“Scouting”** means any person observing the oral round of a team other than the team such person is associated.
- t) **“Speaker”** means one of the two designated speakers on a team.
- u) **“Surrebuttals”** means the reply presented by the respondent in response to the rebuttals.

- v) **“Team”** means the registered representatives of any College/Institution/University participating in the competition and shall include only those members specified under Rule 2 of the competition's rules.
- w) **“Team Code”** means the code allotted to a team through registration on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- x) **“Waiting Room”** refers to the area designated by the OC where participants must report before the start of each oral round.

2) ELIGIBILITY AND TEAM COMPOSITION

- a) The competition is open to all students enrolled bona fide on a regular basis in a law course or its equivalent, conducted by any recognized College/ Institution/ University.
- b) Each team shall comprise three members, two of whom shall be designated as speakers, and the third member shall be designated as a researcher.

3) DRESS CODE

- a) The participants are expected to be in formal attire throughout the competition.
- b) **For female(s):** white or black salwar and white kurta, along with a black blazer and black shoes; or white shirt and black trousers, along with a black blazer and black shoes.
- c) **For males:** white shirt and black trousers, along with a black tie, black blazer, and black shoes.
- d) Kindly note that no team should wear their college's, institution's/University's ID card in accordance with Rule 5 of the competition's rules.

4) REGISTRATION

- a) Interested teams are required to register themselves to participate in the competition by filling out a registration form on this link after paying the registration fees

- b) The deadline for online registration is before February 10th, 2024 (11:59 PM).
- c) A scanned bona fide letter issued by the appropriate authority of the team's

College/Institution/University is required to be uploaded on this link [Registration Form](#)

- d) Once a team registers by completing the formalities given under Rule 4 of the competition, a code (hereinafter “Team Code”) will be assigned to the team by 15th February, 2024.
- e) Any changes in the contact details of team members must be notified to the OC at the earliest. This obligation to inform shall continue throughout the course of the competition, unless such a team is disqualified from the competition.
- f) The OC should prepare certificates for every participating team member. Participants must ensure that their names are spelled correctly.
- g) The mandatory registration **fee for the competition is Rs. 2100/-**. **The registration fee is not refundable.**
- h) Registration fees do not include accommodation.
- i) Accommodation will be provided to the teams upon request for the final round. Teams seeking accommodation are required to pay Rs. 3100/- for all the members of the team after 15th March, 2024. The accommodation fee is not refundable.

5) ANONYMITY OF THE TEAMS

- a) Teams shall not reveal their identity in any form, except by means of the Team Code assigned to them in accordance with the rules of the competition.
- b) Teams shall not, in any way, reveal their identity in the memorials or during the course of the oral rounds. The memorials shall not bear the logo, name, etc. of the team, its members, or the institution/college/university represented by the team.
- c) Any material, including the Compendium, books, legal texts, or any other reference

material, carried into the courtroom for the oral rounds, whether presented to the bench or not, shall not reveal the team's identity and will be devoid of any identification marks or seal of the team or the institution/college/university represented. If anything in the material carried into the oral rounds reveals the team's identity, the team shall discard it to the satisfaction of the organizing committee prior to leaving the waiting room.

- d) Any violation of the competition rules of may attract disqualification of the team from the competition or any other penalty as determined by the OC. The OC decision in this regard shall be final and not subject to challenge.
- e) Any attempt by a team or team member to contact the drafter of the Moot Proposition, either directly or indirectly, for any reason whatsoever after the release of the Moot Proposition and before the competition closes will result in disqualification from the competition.

6) CLARIFICATIONS

- a) To seek clarifications on the Moot Proposition, send an email to fimtsolmootcourt@gmail.com with the subject "Clarifications FIMT-MOOT COURT 2024" by the latest 20th February, 2024 (11:59 PM)
- b) All clarifications, shall be emailed to all teams by February 23, 2024.
- c) The requests for clarification should be explicit and related to the case's facts, not substantive arguments. Any team can submit a maximum of 5 questions.
- d) The OC reserves the right to reply to or reject the clarifications.

7) MEMORIALS

- a) Each team is required to prepare memorials for both sides, i.e., the Appellant and the Respondent of the case.
- b) A memorial shall be identified solely by the team code assigned to the team pursuant to the rules of the competition.
- c) The memorials shall not, in any way, disclose any facts pertaining to the identity of the team,

its members, or the college/institution/university represented by the team.

- d) The memorial shall consist of the following mandatory headings:
- I. Cover Page,
 - II. Table of Contents,
 - III. List of Abbreviations,
 - IV. Index of Authorities,
 - V. Statement of Facts (not exceeding 2 pages),
 - VI. Statement of Issues,
 - VII. Summary of Arguments (not exceeding 3 pages),
 - VIII. Arguments Advanced (not exceeding 15 pages)
 - IX. Prayer (not exceeding 1 sspage).
- e) Memorial should not exceed the page limit of 30, including the cover page. ‘
- f) The cover page of a memorial must contain the following information:
- (i) The Team Code in the upper right-hand corner in accordance with the rules of the competition.
 - (ii) The name and year of the competition.
 - (iii)The name of the case.
 - (iv)The side for which the memorial has been prepared.
 - (v) Name of the forum resolving the dispute.
- g) List of Abbreviations and Index of Authorities.
- i. The List of Abbreviations shall include all abbreviations and acronyms (such as “WTO”, “USA”, etc.) used in the memorials, but shall not include the following symbols: “%”, “&”, “\$”, “¶” and “€”. If any abbreviation does not appear in the List of Abbreviations or vice versa, every instance when it is used in the memorial shall constitute a violation of this rule.
 - ii. All authorities cited in the memorial must be included in the Index of Authorities, and vice versa. If any authority cited in the memorial is not included in the Index of Authorities, or vice versa, every instance in which it is used in the memorial or the Index of Authorities, as the case may be shall constitute a violation of this rule.
 - iii. The list of abbreviations and index of authorities must be in alphabetical order.
- h) Footnotes and Citations
- (i) Teams shall cite all authorities in the memorial using footnotes following the *Bluebook Method of Citation (20th edition)*.
 - (ii) Footnotes shall be limited to citations only, and in no case, shall contain additional

information or arguments.

- i) The memorial shall not contain any annexure, photograph, diagrams, or other representations of like nature.
- j) The Memorial (including the preliminary pages and excluding the cover page) shall adhere to the following mandatory specifications:
 - a. Page size: A4
 - b. Font type: Times New Roman
 - c. Font size: 12
 - d. Line spacing: 1.5
 - e. Body of text: Justified
 - f. Margin: 1 inch on all sides
- k) For footnotes, the formatting specifications are:
 - a. Font type: Times New Roman
 - b. Font size: 10
 - c. Line spacing: 1.0
 - d. Paragraph spacing: 0
 - e. No additional space between 2 footnotes
 - f. Body of text: Justified
- l) The following colour schemes shall be followed for the cover page of the memorial:
 - a. Appellant – Blue
 - b. Respondent – Red

Copies of the written submissions shall comply with the colour scheme prescribed Rules of the competition.

- m) Each team must send a soft copy of the memorial for each side in PDF and Microsoft Word (.docx/.doc) formats via email to fimtsolmootcourt@gmail.com on or before March 5th, 2024 (11:59 PM) and comply with the competition's rules. Any soft copy submission made before March 5, 2024 (11:59 PM) will be considered, in case of late submission 1 mark shall be deducted for each day of delay.
- n) It is the responsibility of each team to ensure that the soft copy of the written submissions in accordance of the following:
 - a) That it can be opened and read with Adobe Acrobat Reader Version 8 and Microsoft Word 97-2003 Document (through use of compatibility mode) or a later version, does

not contain any virus, and are not password protected.

- b) That they are submitted as four (4) separate file attachments: two (2) as a memorial for the Appellant (one each in PDF and Microsoft Word format) and two (2) as memorial for the Respondent (one each in PDF and Microsoft Word format), and
- c) The files are named according to the Team Code and the side for which the memorial is prepared. The Team Code on the upper-right hand corner of the cover page is to follow the same format. (For instance, Team Code 004 will name its Memorial for the Appellant as 004 P and Written Submission for the Respondent as 004 R.) Use of any other format (example “Team 004 P” or “Team 004 R”) will be penalized.
- o) Teams are required to send the soft copies of the memorials well in time, taking all contingencies into account. Equipment failure, computer disk failure, internet connectivity issues, etc. shall not be considered as grounds for late submission of memorials in determining any penalty imposed.

Any decision of the OC regarding the deductions shall be final.

8) STRUCTURE OF THE COMPETITION

The competition shall be conducted on 14th and 15th March, 2024 Draw of Lots shall be conducted on 13th March, 2024. The memorial exchange session shall be conducted four times during the full Competition - once before the Preliminary Rounds, before the Quarter Final Rounds, before the Semi Final Rounds and lastly before the Final Round.

- The Competition shall consist of the following Oral Rounds:
 - (a) The Preliminary Rounds,
 - (b) The Quarter Final Rounds,
 - (c) The Semi Final Rounds,
 - (d) The Final Round.

The teams participating in a round shall be provided with a copy of the opposing team's memorial prior to the oral round in the memorial exchange session.

Preliminary Rounds

The preliminary rounds shall be conducted on March 14th, 2024. There will be two Preliminary Rounds (Round 1 & Round 2), and each Team shall argue once as the Appellant and once as the Respondent. The team that argues as the appellant in the first round shall argue as the respondent in the second round, and vice versa. The pairing of teams for the preliminary rounds shall be done by a draw of lots by the organizing committee. Each team will receive the opposing team's memorial in the memorial exchange 30 minutes before the oral rounds. No team shall be provided with any information regarding the identity of the opposing teams or any other team participating in the competition.

The top eight (8) teams will qualify to the Quarter Final Rounds. The teams will be ranked according to the following scheme:

- a. Scores of preliminary round 1 + scores of preliminary round 2 = Total Preliminary Round Score
- b. In the case of a tie, memorial scores shall be added to the total preliminary

round score.

Quarter Final / Semi Final Rounds

The Quarter-Final Round will be held on March 15th, 2024, and the same day knockout rounds shall be conducted.

The pairing of teams for the quarter-finals shall be done by a draw of lots. A tie will be resolved by adding the memorial scores to the cumulative oral scores of the quarter-finals. If a tie still persists, then Researchers' Test scores would also be added to it.

The Semi-Final Rounds will be conducted on March 15th, 2024 and will be knockout rounds. The pairing of teams for the semi-finals shall also be done by a draw of lots.

The teams in Quarter-Final Rounds shall be provided with a soft copy of the opposing team's memorial prior to the oral round in the memorial exchange session on March 15th, 2024. For Semi-final Rounds, teams shall be provided with a soft copy of the opposing team's memorial in the memorial exchange session on March 15th, 2024.

Final Round

The Final Rounds of the competition will be held on March 30th, 2024. The sides for which the teams will argue will be determined through a draw of lots.

Researchers' Test

The Researchers' Test shall be conducted on March 15th, 2024, in virtual mode. The member of the team designated as the researcher shall attend the test, and such researcher shall not be allowed to address the bench unless asked by the bench during the oral rounds.

The duration of the Researchers' Test shall be one (1) hour, and it shall be in the Multiple-Choice Question format.

The Researchers' Test shall test the knowledge of the laws involved, as well as the factual details of the Moot Proposition and the application of the relevant laws to the circumstances in the moot proposition. No notes, legal texts, books, or any other reference material or electronic aids shall be permitted during the researchers' test.

9) ORAL ROUNDS

Teams shall submit their oral arguments throughout the competition in the following order:

Speaker 1 for Appellant Speaker 2 for Appellant, Speaker 1 for Respondent Speaker 2 for Respondent. No researcher of any team is allowed to address the bench.

Speaker 1 and Speaker 2 shall remain the same throughout the competition.

Only one speaker from each team will present the rebuttals. The appellant's rebuttals will be limited to responding to the respondent's oral arguments. Before the oral round commences, the team's speakers of the team shall inform the court clerks of the following information, this information shall not be amended thereafter:

- a. Time reserved by each speaker for oral arguments, as well as for rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be, in accordance with the rules of the competition.
- b. Extensions of time may be granted only in extraordinary circumstances at the discretion of the bench, and are strongly discouraged.
- c. Teams shall not reveal their identity (including the names of the participants) throughout the duration of the oral rounds.
- d. No photographs, graphs, diagrams, tables, or any other representations of a similar nature prepared by the team can be passed to the panel under any circumstances whatsoever.
- e. Only researchers may pass research materials, other written materials, or notes in the form of chits to the speaker who may be speaking, after taking permission from the bench.
- f. Any team that violates any of the rules with respect to the oral rounds may be penalized. The decision of the bench shall be final in this regard.
- g. The oral arguments shall be confined to the issues presented in the memorial for the preliminary rounds. Apart from the participating teams for such rounds, members of other teams are not allowed to observe such round. Scouting is strictly prohibited, and scouting by any team shall entail instant disqualification. The OC's decision in this regard is final and not subject to challenge.
- h. Teams shall reserve at least one (1) minute for rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be, for all oral rounds throughout the duration of the competition. However, no team shall, reserve more than 5 minutes for the same.

Preliminary Rounds

Maximum time duration for oral rounds is 40 minutes, wherein each team shall be allotted 20 minutes (including rebuttals or surrebuttals). Any extension of time beyond this specified period is subject to the discretion of the bench.

No speaker of a team shall speak for more than 15 minutes, excluding the time reserved for rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be.

Quarter Final / Semi Final Rounds

Each oral round will be for a period of 60 minutes wherein each team will be allotted 30 minutes (including rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be). Any extension of time beyond this specified period is subject to the discretion of the bench.

No speaker of a team shall speak for more than 25 minutes, excluding the time reserved for rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be.

Final Round

The oral round shall be for a period of 90 minutes wherein each team will be allotted 45 minutes (including rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be.) Any extension of time beyond this specified period is subject to the discretion of the bench.

No speaker shall speak for more than 30 minutes, excluding the time reserved for rebuttals or surrebuttals, as the case may be.

- The Best Orator shall be determined based on the highest score awarded in the Preliminary Round.
- The Best Researcher shall be determined through the Researchers' Test conducted in accordance with rule 8 of the rules of the competition.
- All members of each team shall be awarded certificates of participation, and all the winners of the awards specified in Rule 11 of the rules of the competition shall be awarded Merit Certificates. semi finalist and quarter finalist teams shall be awarded merit certificates.
- The OC reserves the right to make any changes to the above-mentioned rules.

12) ACCOMMODATION, FOOD, AND TRANSPORTATION

- Accommodations shall be provided to the teams for the final round on March 30th, 2024.
- Teams shall be responsible for their transportation to and from the airport/ railway station / bus station to the accommodation.

13) CODE OF CONDUCT

- a) A violation of the prescribed code of conduct will invite sanctions, which will be decided by the OC.
- b) Teams are expected to behave with other team members, the bench or OC or volunteers in a dignified manner.
- c) Teams should not attempt to influence Judges or OC in any manner.
- d) Participants are expected to maintain decorum in the court during the Competition and conduct themselves in a manner befitting the legal profession.
- e) The teams should not engage in any form of unethical, unprofessional, or wrongful conduct during the entire period of the competition.
- f) Participants should not indulge in the consumption or carrying of drugs, alcohol or arms or ammunitions or immoral or illegal activity or any other form(s) of taste or addiction during the course of the Competition.

14) TECHNICAL RULES

- a) The Competition will be conducted using an online live video conferencing platform. The details of the platform shall be shared with the teams via mail.
- b) To ensure the smooth functioning of the competition, all participants will participate from their respective places. No team shall be seated together for the purpose of the Competition.
- c) An invitation link to the meeting will be sent to participants on their respective email IDs, which they submitted in Registration Form or through WhatsApp, prior to each round.
- d) The participants are expected to be seated in a quiet space free from any echoes and isolated from any forms of disturbance.
- e) The participants must ensure that the background is plain and sober, which does not disturb the judges. Preference will be given to a white background. The participants must also ensure that their appearance is the same as in a passport size photo, i.e., only their head and shoulders should be visible, and that the participant is visible in Portrait Mode / Vertical Manner.

- f) The participants should make necessary preparations before entering the meeting room, i.e., downloading the required application and ensuring that their device is compliant with the terms mentioned.
- g) The participants should only use their team code as their username while joining the meeting room.
- h) All participants should be online at least ten (10) minutes prior to the commencement of their round. In case any team fails to join the courtroom within ten (10) minutes, then the opposite team shall proceed ex parte.
- i) The following are the mandatory system requirements to participate in the competition:
- Computer/Laptop with a well configured web cam.,
 - A stable Internet Connection with speed more than 5 MBPS,
 - Headphones or Earplugs that have a working microphone.
- j) During a round, participants must have their cameras on at all times.
- k) Utmost care shall be taken by the teams as regards to external sound or noise while the proceedings are on. During the oral round, participants should ensure that the same is conducted from a noise-free environment. At the time when the one participant is speaking, other participants are expected to keep their microphones on mute. If a participant is found disturbing the other participant anyway, they may be disqualified.
- l) The participants should not use the group text feature of the organizer's hosting platform to communicate with one another.
- m) No additional documentation or screen sharing will be allowed. Any information which has to be provided to the court should be submitted beforehand along with the Compendium and the Memorial.
- n) In case internet connection of speaker 1 is lost or if that speaker faces any other difficulty in connecting, a time limit of five (5) minutes shall be given to that speaker to reconnect. After five (5) minutes are over, speaker 2 will take over to put forth his arguments. If Speaker 1 fails to reconnect, the team will be marked based on the arguments put forth by Speaker 2 and Speaker 1, only if he has put forth any arguments before disconnection.
- o) The organizers shall not be responsible for any loss due to slow or non-functional internet connection during the competition.

- p) In any case whatsoever, the decision of the Organizers shall be final and binding.

- a) The OC reserves the right to amend, modify, change, or repeal any of the rules of the Competition. The OC shall communicate any changes made to the Rules of the competition to the teams.
- b) The OC reserves the right to make decisions on any matter not mentioned in the rules of the competition. Any such decision made by the OC shall be final and binding.
- c) The OC reserves the right to interpret any of the rules of the competition. Such interpretation shall be final and binding.
- d) If any one member of a team is notified or informed of any detail or information concerning the competition, it shall be deemed as if the said team as a whole has been duly notified or informed.
- e) The copyright in the memorials shall vest with FIMT- School of Law. FIMT- School of Law shall not be responsible for any liability accrued to any person or for any loss caused to any person because of the content of the memorials.
- f) Any audio or video recording of oral pleadings by any team is prohibited.
- g) If a team believes that the rules of the competition have been violated at any stage of the competition, the team shall, within half an hour after the completion of the round in which the alleged violation occurred, register a complaint with the Student convenors of the competition.
- h) Teams shall not approach the bench with any complaints, under any circumstances whatsoever.
